Remembrance of A Deceased Board of Education Member

The New Jersey School Boards Association recognizes the desirability and importance of remembering the contributions of individuals who, during their lifetime, unselfishly dedicated their time and energy to the welfare of their community as a member of a board of education. Each of the approximately 5,000 individuals who every year serve on a board of education is deserving of such acknowledgement.

The NJSBA also recognizes that such remembrances are most meaningful and sincere when made by people who have learned to know and respect an individual through common effort and shared aspirations.

The NJSBA believes that personal respect and admiration is most reflected in a county association and that, therefore, the county association is the most appropriate body to represent the collective memory and feeling of New Jersey school board members.

The New Jersey School Boards Association also recognizes the desirability and importance of remembering the special contributions of individuals who, during their lifetime and while fulfilling the many responsibilities of a district board member, have demonstrated an exemplary commitment to education, children, and society by serving as a member of the New Jersey School Boards Association's official family of officers and Board of Directors and alternates. The NJSBA believes that an appropriate expression of its feelings in such instances is an official testimony by the Board of Directors presented to those who were closest to the individual as a representation of the collective appreciation of all who share or have shared in the same commitment.

The NJSBA recognizes that undeniably extraordinary contributions to New Jersey education have been made which warrant special notice. The NJSBA believes that the contribution of individuals who so singularly distinguish themselves among their peers should be so acknowledged.
