

GOVERNANCE PROCEDURES  
MEMBERSHIP ON ASSOCIATION COMMITTEES

Membership on Association Committees

Only members of duespaying boards are eligible to serve as members of Association committees. As soon as a board falls into arrears, notice shall be sent to both the board and the committee member. If the dues are not paid within 30 days after notice, the President shall appoint a successor to the committee member in accordance with the bylaws.

Should a committee member cease to be a member of a local board of education, his/her service on the committee may continue for the duration of the committee's deliberations, or until the next Delegate Assembly, whichever occurs first. If necessary, and in accordance with the Bylaws, the President shall appoint a successor member to the committee. However, the President may permit a nonboard member to continue to serve on a committee if there is a need in the interest of the Association to do so.

All board members from boards in good standing shall be eligible to be appointed to any Association committee and shall be appointed by the President in a manner that is representative of our membership. Board members may only be appointed to one ad hoc committee at a time.

To ensure that the number of board members participating in committee activities is broad and continually enlarging, the Executive Director shall establish procedures to assist in identifying interested and eligible board members for service on ad hoc committees.
