

Who are we?

 ASAP-NJ was founded in 1983 to meet the needs of New Jersey youth in education, prevention, intervention, and referral services in areas of highrisk behaviors including the use of alcohol, tobacco, other drugs, and addictive behaviors. A not-forprofit organization, the group is made up of over 300 Student Assistance Professionals (SAPs), Student Assistance Coordinators (SACs) prevention specialists, educators, and health care professionals.

What's a SAC???

- Academic and attendance problems are often due to underlying issues.
- Student Assistance Counseling is a process where students meet with a specially trained professional counselor to discuss any problem they may be experiencing, such as:
 - Family problems
 - School problems
 - Drugs / alcohol (42 CFR)
 - Depression and other emotional problems
 - Relationship issues
 - Stress or anxiety
 - Bullying
 - Eating disorders
 - ANY other issues



What we're seeing

Drugs and alcohol

Mental health

- Stress and anxiety disorders
- Depression, suicide
- Self-injurious behaviors
- Eating disorders

Social - emotional

- LGBTQI issues






The series follows the dysfunctional family of Frank Gallagher, a single father of six children. While he spends his days drunk, his kids learn to take care of themselves.
